What is an Ultrasound?

Ultrasound is an easy and non-invasive way to see internal structures of the body. It sends high frequency sound waves through the skin and produces images of major organs and blood vessels. A high-speed computer “translates” the soundwaves into an image of the blood vessel. Then measurements of blood flow can be attained.

What is Doppler?

Doppler ultrasound is a special form of ultrasound. With Doppler ultrasound it is possible to both see the structures inside the body and to evaluate blood flow at the same time. An audible sound may be used or the flow may be shown as a graphic or color display.

The average Doppler ultrasound exam takes from 45 to 90 minutes. The length of the exam depends upon a number of factors, including the portion of the body to be examined and the complexity of the anatomy. With atherosclerosis, or hardening of the arteries, the vessels may be very difficult to evaluate and may require a longer amount of scanning time.

Preparation:

Drink 24 ounces of water one hour prior to exam with no voiding.

Parking/Registration:

Park in the Mercy Medical Center 10th Street Parking Ramp, located at the corner of 10th Street and 8th Ave. SE. You will be pre-registered, so you can proceed to **Ground (G)** level and follow the signs to “Radiology (X-Ray),” also located on Ground (G) level.

If you are having this procedure at the Mercy Health Plaza Imaging Center:

The Imaging Center is located in the NE corner of the Plaza next to Galaxy Theatre, at 5264 Council St. NE. Park in front of the building. You will be pre-registered, so you can proceed to the Reception desk.

Procedure Results (Who interprets the results):

A radiologist will review the images shortly after the exam is completed. A written report will be sent to your doctor. Your doctor will discuss the results with you. Please allow your physician time to review these results, usually 2 business days after the exam.
