What is a CT Scan?

CT scanning—sometimes called CAT scanning—is a non-invasive, painless medical test that helps physicians diagnose and treat medical conditions.

CT imaging uses special X-ray equipment to produce multiple images or pictures of the inside of the body and a computer to join them together in cross-sectional views of the area being studied. The images can then be examined on a computer monitor or printed.

CT scans of internal organs, bone, soft tissues and blood vessels provide greater clarity than conventional X-ray exams.

Exam requires the injection of a contrast medium (iodine) in a vein. This CT scan usually takes approximately 45 minutes.

Preparation:

Do not eat or drink for 4 hours prior to exam. Take Beta Blockers per ordering physician. Discontinue male enhancement medication 4 days prior to exam.

There are no special routines after the CT scan. You will be able to eat after the scan unless your doctor has indicated otherwise. The results of the scan will be sent to your doctor.

Exams That Require Contrast:

If you are having an IV contrast for your CT exam, a lab blood test called Serum Creatinine is usually required if you are older than 60, diabetic or have high blood pressure. The blood test can be done within 30 days prior to the exam or at the time of the exam.
